## *Programs, Requirements, and Deadlines*

Please carefully read our application instructions for a complete description of all application requirements and policies. The instructions are available in two places:

All applicants to the Graduate School of Arts and Science (GSAS) are required to submit a complete application for admission. In addition to the application form questions, a complete application includes academic transcripts, test scores, letters of recommendation, a résumé or curriculum vitae, a statement of purpose, and the application fee.

### **APPLICATION DEADLINES**

All application materials must be **received by** 5 p.m. eastern time on the deadline date. Deadline dates are provided for each program in the section labeled “Application Deadlines.” If an application deadline falls on a Saturday, Sunday or legal U.S. holiday, then the next business day will be the deadline date.

### **TEST SCORE REQUIREMENTS**

- The Graduate School requires that applicants submit official test scores for the general test of the Graduate Record Examination (GRE) unless an exception is specifically noted under program-specific requirements.
- The Test of English as a Foreign Language (TOEFL) is required of all applicants who are not native English speakers (this requirement is waived if the applicant has completed a baccalaureate or master’s degree at an institution where the language of instruction is English).
- The Graduate School requires **official** test scores for the GRE and TOEFL. Self-reported test scores and copies of test score reports from the GRE and TOEFL programs are **not** considered official. Official test scores must be sent to us directly from the GRE or TOEFL program; make sure they are sent to **New York University—GSAS, code 2596**. Refer to the application instructions for complete information about how to properly submit official test scores to the Graduate School.
- Full details about the testing policies are available in our FAQ on testing in the Application Resource Center. Please read the information carefully.

## PROGRAM-SPECIFIC APPLICATION REQUIREMENTS

The following pages include program-specific application requirements that are in addition to the requirements noted above.

- The Graduate School requires that you apply by using the online application. (Certain applicants to non-degree programs are not able to use the online application. Refer to *Application Policies* in the Application Resource Center.)
- If a program recommends or requires a subject test of the GRE, it is specified in the section labeled “GRE and TOEFL.”
- If a program requires a writing sample, it is described. Please note that the writing sample is **in addition to** the personal statement that is a standard part of the application.
- If a program has any other special requirements, they will be listed.
- Applicants to **dual degree programs** (programs offered by GSAS and another school at NYU, such as the School of Law, Medicine, Business, or Public Service) must apply to each school separately. Admission to the dual degree program is contingent upon acceptance by both schools.

## FIELD OF STUDY DESCRIPTIONS

The field of study descriptions may not exactly match the actual program name on the degree that is conferred. *Writing Sample (all programs except the joint master's with Journalism):* An academic writing sample is required.

*Writing Sample (Africana Studies/Journalism):* Two different writing samples are required. One should be an academic writing sample. The second should represent your aptitude for journalism. A clip from your college newspaper, a personal essay, academic research paper, and short fiction are all acceptable.

It may be a term paper, excerpt from an undergraduate or graduate thesis, published article, or other example of academic writing, and should indicate your capacity for interdisciplinary study and research. Your entire writing sample should not exceed 25 double-spaced pages.

It should be no more than ten double-spaced pages and should be excerpted from a term paper, essay or other writing that illustrates the applicant's ability to present a written argument on a scholarly topic, preferably in the discipline or geographical area in which the applicant wishes to specialize.

**GRE and TOEFL:** GRE general test required. After submitting a completed application, applicants may request a waiver of the GRE requirement if they hold a Ph.D. or a post-baccalaureate professional degree (e.g., M.D., J.D.), or if they have taken the LSAT or MCAT. Contact the program directly regarding consideration for a waiver. TOEFL required of all applicants who are not native English speakers (see Test Score Requirements on page 1).

**Writing Sample:** A 10-page (double-spaced) essay on an ethical issue of concern in health care or environmental affairs is required. You should aim to take a position on the issue you have identified and offer reasoned arguments for why one position should be adopted rather than another.

**Dual Degree Applicants:** Dual degree applicants must also apply to the School of Medicine (if not already an enrolled student in Medicine), following their specific application procedures and deadline date.
